




Year 3 and 4 Carol Concert

The Christmasaurus is a magical tale, written by Tom Fletcher. The story is about a special dinosaur... not just any dinosaur... but a dinosaur who loves Christmas. His name is the Christmasaurus!

The Christmasaurus longs to fly and pull Santa's sleigh. He faces many challenges but William, a kind boy, helps him overcome these.

Year 2 have been reading the picture-book version of the story - the illustrations in the book are bright and cheerful and they make you feel like you are part of the adventure.

Year 3 have been reading the full novel which is written in a fun, modern Roald Dahl/David Walliams style. Tom Fletcher, the author, who is famous for being a member of the band McFly, wrote his first book with a bandmate in 2016 and has gone on to become a best-selling author whose stories have captured children's imaginations across the world.

This story is full of laughter and lessons about friendship and kindness and has been a real hit with Year 2 and 3.

The Christmas Miracle of Jonathan Toomy by Susan Wojciechowski (Illustrated by P.J. Lynch)

"A little story with a big story"

This beautifully illustrated and moving book is a tale of the spirit and generosity that all people hold in their hearts, especially at this holiday time.


Jonathan Toomey is a woodcarver in a small village, known (and feared) for his gruff manner. But before the story itself truly begins, the author lets us in on a secret: Mr. Toomey wasn't always this way. Once he was young and full of life, but he closed himself off after suffering terrible grief. Throughout the story, you see his transformation as he meets the young widow McDowell and her son Thomas.

The widow McDowell and Thomas show up at Mr. Toomey's door with a request: they've lost their set of nativity figures and ask him to make them a new set. The carving of each figure – watched and questioned by Thomas – reveals a little more of Jonathan Toomy and the gentle kindness of widow McDowell leads to a happy ending (though you may need a tissue on the way!).

This is a book for all the family to curl up with and share: with beautiful pictures to get lost in and a

more complex text that allows great discussions and more confident readers to enjoy independently. There is also a film of the story available.








